



Forged From Fire, Made With Excellence

FOR 29 YEARS, THE ACTOR° has served as a proud symbol of the Screen Actors Guild Awards°. Made by a gifted team of artisans at the American Fine Arts Foundry in Burbank, California, the statuettes embody the spirit of every actor and serve as a testament of the year's most brilliant performances.

WAX ON, WAX ON

Each award statuette is made using a 5,000-year-old wax-casting technique originating from India. The process begins with the melting and pouring of 95 pounds of wax into silica rubber molds. Later in the process, after layers of ceramics are poured over the initial molds, a "wax slurry" — an additional layer of wax and silica — is added to preserve the statuette's finer details.

OUT OF THE MOLD

Overall, two different molds are created. The first, made of silica rubber, initially forms The Actor's body and, separately, its arms. Once the mold pieces are cooled and cleaned, the pieces are put together and The Actor emerges fully formed!





FORGED IN FIRE

Fire is the most important element of building The Actor. Not only does it initially help melt the wax, but 750 pounds of bronze is later melted and added into the second mold. At the end of the process, foundry artisans use metal chasing, a technique that uses fire to oxidize the statuettes' polished surfaces, giving them their iconic coloring.

29 Years of Memories

PLANNING THE SAG AWARDS[®] IS undoubtedly an exciting yet daunting task. But year after year, the SAG Awards Committee outdoes itself to create a memorable ceremony that honors some of the union's most talented actors. With so many years of experience under their belt and a golden ticket to each show, the committee shares some of their favorite moments from over the years.



SHOW UP ON TIME

"The moments I have loved most at the SAG Awards are the speeches our fellow actors give about what it means to be an actor and express their love and respect for their fellow actors," recalls SAG Awards Committee Chair JoBeth

Williams. "I have been moved by so many of them, but one really stands out for me. It was Helen Mirren's Life Achievement Award speech this past year. My favorite line was when she said she learned early on that an actor's rule should be, 'Show up on time and don't be an ass.' It made me laugh because it's so perfect. And then she made me cry as she talked about the real things we go through as actors. The constant fear, nausea and vomiting because we are putting ourselves out there in front of people all the time and may look like total fools.

"Every actor can tell you that is true. And that we choose to do that to ourselves is an amazing idea. And yet we continue because we love having the chance to disappear into new characters."

SAVING THE DAY

"Looking back, what stands out for me are the times an

actor has saved us," says SAG Awards Committee Vice Chair Daryl Anderson. "There was the final year of NYPD Blue when Dennis Franz, who'd been at the show each year, was set to do the nomination announcements. The problem was an overnight mudslide closed the freeway that would have gotten him here. There was no way he could do it. On extremely short notice, our talent executive reached out to James Denton of Desperate Housewives. He showed up in the nick of time -6 a.m. - and performed beautifully and enthusiastically. One

of the best nominations announcements ever, and no one was the wiser that it was all an improv.

"Another year, Russell Crowe was set to introduce the clip package for *3:10 to* Yuma when he was felled by flu on show day. SAG Awards Executive Producer Kathy Connell went to Russell's co-star Ben Foster, interrupting dinner at his table moments before showtime, and asked him to pinch hit. No rehearsal. Ben didn't hesitate — again,

a smooth, energized, professional moment that no one would dream was done on the hoof."

BEST DINNER PARTY EVER

"Like all people working in the industry who've lived

in Hollywood for a minute, we've learned to play it cool despite whatever level of freak-out is happening inside. The SAG Awards definitely puts that to the test, but normally we hold strong," says SAG Awards Committee member Jason George. "But my wife and I are ridiculous GoT fans [Game of Thrones for the uninitiated]. Near the end of the show's run, we knew the whole cast was going to be at the SAG Awards and we were prepared to stay chill - however, we had recently seen the original cast of Hamilton on Broadway and, through friends of friends of friends, gotten backstage. As fate would have it, the

friend of a friend was the violinist and concertmaster for the show, a man named Jonny Dinklage — brother to one Peter Dinklage. It turns out that all the Dinklages are good people who are super talented and always up for some rowdy fun.

"So the only GoT cast member we approached was Peter Dinklage because we had the perfect not-too-fanboy excuse for getting a selfie. That night of the SAG Awards, I texted Jonny Dinklage a photo of me, my wife and his brother, Peter, flipping him the bird.

A SENSE OF FAMILY

"What [always] stands out to me is the experience of the interconnected community and feeling of family that you get in the showroom and my own little taste of it," says SAG Awards Committee member Elizabeth McLaughlin.
"When I was younger, I worked on a family Christmas movie with some

incredible actors that I looked up to that I couldn't believe I was getting to work with and learn from. One of those actors was Sam Elliott. At that time, I was struggling



with the self-doubt and rejection that comes with being an actor, and unsure if I believed in myself enough to succeed. I will never forget

the day of shooting my big scene with Sam and him pulling me aside to validate and encourage me, citing his own belief in my talent. I've thought of that in moments of doubt since.

"Fast forward to nearly a decade later at the 26th SAG Awards, when I was able to reintroduce myself, thank him for those words of encouragement and tell him just how much that moment on set meant to me. During the SAG Awards, you get the feeling that those kinds of conversations are happening all around you. I felt lucky to have had my own."



BONDED IN ART

"I have so many it's truly hard to to pick just one. Or even one dozen," jokes SAG Awards Committee member Woody Schultz. "So I'll just name the first few that come to mind: the fun and lighthearted moments such as the young actors from Stranger Things and Black-

ish in an epic dance battle at our gala; the sidesplitting antics from the cast of

Bridesmaids as they took the stage and introduced us to their favorite on-set drinking game in honor of director Martin Scorsese; and the pure joy of watching the cast of Downton Abbey shutting the party down each year on the dance floor. Then there is the absolute honor I've had to meet some of my

childhood heroes and acting idols like Rita Moreno, Dick Van Dyke, Carol Burnett, Helen Mirren, Debbie Reynolds, Jeff Bridges and so many more.

"But I think my favorite moments are when we and the world get to witness the beautiful love, compassion and, at times, righteous anger our members display on behalf of the most vulnerable among us. Whether it was Ashton Kutcher speaking out against the Muslim ban; the cast of *Orange Is the New Black* speaking up for

women of color from around the globe; Ariana DeBose giving voice and hope to young queer performers, especially those of color; Nicole Kidman addressing sexism and ageism in the entertainment industry; or David Harbor literally shouting down bullies and oppressors of every stripe on behalf of the outcasts and misfits who feel they have no voice or place in the world.

"Our show is so special because everyone in that room is bonded in their art, in their dedication and, most especially, their humanity."




Since then, the Foundation has produced more than 10,000 free remote educational



ikability and "Hollywood icon" don't always go hand-in-hand. When it comes to Sally Field, however, one would be hard-pressed to find a peer, colleague or fan who doesn't hold the petite star with the big talent close to their heart.

Field's 60-year career is so varied and rich that Baby Boomers who identified with her bubbly, Gidget girl-surfer or haphazard flying nun are equally as adoring as Generation X, who grew up with *Smokey and the Bandit* and *Steel Magnolias*, and millennials and Z's who see her as the nurturing mom in *Forrest Gump* and supportive Aunt May in *The Amazing Spider-Man*. In short, Sally Field offers something for everyone.


For SAG-AFTRA — as a labor union — Field is esteemed not only for her years of dedicated artistry, but for her brilliant, Oscar-winning turn as the titular character in Norma Rae, a working-class mother who puts it all on the line to bring equity and safety to her fellow laborers in a small-town textile mill. Based on a true story, Rae's depiction of what union organizers historically faced

when they shed blood, sweat and tears to achieve equity for workers is a powerful and timeless statement. In fact, at SAG-AFTRA's national headquarters in Los Angeles, Field in that courageous role appears as the centerpiece of a large cinematic painting featuring other irrefutable icons and legends (see page 99).

SAG-AFTRA President Fran Drescher sees Field as champion both onscreen and off.

"Sally is an amazing actor with an enormous range," said Drescher. "She has an enduring career because she is authentic in her performance and always projects likability and humanity — she just connects ... and has never stopped being extraordinary."

Born in Pasadena, California, Sally
Margaret Field was 12 when she made
her acting debut in a junior high school
production of *Born Yesterday*, playing the
part of Billie Dawn. "I wasn't good. I knew
I wasn't," she wrote in her 2018 New York
Times bestselling memoir In Pieces. "It was
like Heidi, the little goat girl, had taken a
stab at *Hedda Gabler*."

Nevertheless, something had been birthed, and she knew that, too — a sense of self that brought with it the ability to detach from what people thought of her, and even what she thought about herself, if only fleetingly. It was exhilarating and something she would seek more of. "A new sensation had brushed past me," she writes, "and, for one moment, I felt free."

Three years after appearing as an uncredited extra "Beatnik Girl in Lineup" in 1962's drive-in feature *Moon Pilot*, Field landed her first memorable role as TV's *Gidget*, the spritely teen beach bunny embroiled in weekly madcap adventures. Field had been Taft-Hartley'd into the project during the pilot and received her official SAG card in 1965. "It was a huge moment for me," she told *SAG-AFTRA*. "In fact, I wish I'd kept that first card!" She also reflected on the evolution of the union.

"I've been so grateful to see how much stronger the union has been getting over the last 60 years — and really trying to protect me and all the actors as the world changes. I wish I'd had these protections starting out!"

While Field's incarnation of the surfing girl lasted only one season, it was enough to land her on Hollywood's radar, and other wholesome roles soon followed. Three seasons as Sister Bertrille on *The Flying Nun* and a brief stint in *The Girl with Something Extra*, a sitcom

in which she played a young woman with ESP, was enough goody-goody typecasting for Field, and she attempted a breakout via some dramatic turns in TV movies and guest appearances on shows like Night Gallery and Marcus Welby, MD. Finally, help came along, and at the insistence of her Nun costar, the iconic Madeleine Sherwood, Field showed up at the famed Actors Studio and soon began studying with legendary teacher Lee Strasberg, alongside contemporaries Jack Nicholson, Ellen Burstyn and others.

She was determined to be taken seriously, and after years with Strasberg, who she credits as an essential influence, not only in the development of her craft but in her growth as a human, Field fought her way into her first significant dramatic role, the title character in NBC's television film Sybil. Starring opposite Oscar-winning legend Joanne Woodward, Field was not the favorite of producers, but after Woodward tested with Field, she told producers if they didn't

cast the young actress, she would leave the project. Taking that ultimatum proved a wise choice. Field's harrowing portrayal of a young woman attempting to unravel years of confusion from an undiagnosed dissociative identity disorder (formerly referred to as "split personalities") with the help

of a knowledgeable psychiatrist (Woodward) won her the Primetime Emmy for Outstanding Lead Actress in a Special Program in 1977.

Years later, Field recalled in an oral history with the Television Academy Foundation the impact of Sybil at the time, saying, "It was real landmark stuff for television. No one

> was doing anything about child abuse back then. We received so many letters from doctors and psychiatrists who said patients had come in with breakthroughs because of viewing the film. It had enormous power – and that is the power television can have if used correctly."

To the surprise of critics

and fans — and even Field herself — she took a leap of faith into the action-comedy genre the following year in *Smokey and the Bandit*, a project famously known for not having much of a shooting script but that did have the world's most popular movie star, Burt Reynolds, in the driver's seat. It also got her onto the big screen, right where she wanted to be.

Two more Reynolds collaborations followed and, in 1979, despite objections from studio bosses — and after every major actor in town had rejected the part — director Martin Ritt asked Field, his first choice, to take on the role of brassy textile-mill-worker-turned-unstoppable-union-activist Norma Rae. The Oscar (and Cannes award) for Best Actress was her prize, and a whole new world of opportunities now beckoned.

During the 1980s, Field was a staple on the big screen, appearing in dramas and romantic comedies opposite some of Hollywood's top leading men, such as Paul Newman (Absence of Malice), James Garner (Murphy's Romance) and Tom Hanks (Punchline) — the latter two produced by her company Fogwood Films — but it was Places in the Heart that returned her to the award stage.

Written and directed by Robert Benton and featuring John Malkovich and Danny Glover, *Heart* brought Field her second Academy Award for Best Actress, for which she delivered her now-famous heartfelt and gleeful acceptance speech that ensured











everyone really did like her. Field spoke about that legendary moment with the American Academy of Achievement in 2005.

"I wasn't terribly eloquent about it, but then, I'm not really terribly eloquent," she laughed. "All of this was really happening to me after I'd come from what I'd come from? I think I said exactly what I meant and I owned it."

The '90s would see Field continuing to appear in hits and fan favorites, including 1989's beloved ensemble piece *Steel Magnolias* and another raucous ensemble in *Soapdish*. The dramatic *Not Without My Daughter* and the lighthearted and loving turns in *Mrs. Doubtfire* and *Forrest Gump* (she did not mind playing Tom Hanks' mother, though only 10 years his senior) rounded out the decade, with Field occasionally returning to television for guest spots.

In the 2000s, Field garnered good reviews in a recurring role on *ER*, for which she won a Primetime Emmy, and later won another Emmy, as well as a Screen Actors Guild Award, for her role in the critically acclaimed family drama *Brothers & Sisters*, which she also executive produced.

The silver screen beckoned once again and, in 2012, Field briefly joined the Marvel Universe as Peter Parker's Aunt May in *The Amazing Spider-Man* and its sequel, and that same year she received her third Oscar nomination and seventh SAG Award nomination, this time for the role of Mary

Todd Lincoln in Steven Spielberg's epic historical drama *Lincoln*. Field followed up this heralded performance with a smaller and more personal film, director Michael Showalter's indie hit, *Hello, My Name Is Doris*.

So many years of experience under her belt has made Field smarter and wiser, but she must still constantly reinvent herself. And, younger performers would do well to heed her advice.

"It's hard to give sage wisdom about anything," she told *SAG-AFTRA*, "but I do know that if you're not in this particular business

because it's what you have to do to breathe, to feel alive ... then you're probably in it for the wrong reason. If you think it's going to be a lot of stardom or a lot of financial success, eh, you're probably in the wrong place. If I were starting out now and were 16, I'd probably just go to college!" she laughed.

In recent years, Field returned to the stage once again in The Glass Menagerie on Broadway, receiving a Tony nomination, took on Arthur Miller's All My Sons at the Old Vic in the UK, and appeared in several new media projects, including Maniac on Netflix and Dispatches From Elsewhere on AMC.

In 2012, Field was inducted into the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and in 2015. then-President Barack Obama honored her with the National Medal of Arts. In 2019, she received the Kennedy Center Honor.

Field is deeply committed to using her platform to support numerous charitable organizations and advocate for social change. Her activism placed a global spotlight on the alarming disappearances of young women in the Mexican border town of Ciudad Juárez, and on issues such as nuclear proliferation, where she joined forces with Dr. Helen Caldicott and Lily Tomlin.

She also continues to bring awareness to issues and causes close to her heart, such as women's health, LGBTQ+ rights, and protesting for climate change action and awareness (for which she was proudly arrested along with friend Jane Fonda in Washington, D.C., in 2019). She also sits on the Board of Directors of Vital Voices Global Partnership, an international women's nonprofit and nongovernmental organization that directly invests in changemakers across the world, promoting women in leadership positions.

While it truly seems that Field has done it all, she is by no means singing her swan song. In addition to her new film, the family drama

> Spoiler Alert, she appears for the first time with Fonda and fellow SAG Life Achievement honorees Lily Tomlin and Rita Moreno in the comedic, sports-related ensemble piece, 80 for Brady. "It was so much fun to make," Field told SAG-AFTRA. "We laughed a lot, and I wanted for at least once in my life to work with my

dear, dear, friend Jane."

On Feb. 26, Sally Field will receive the SAG Life Achievement honor, a merit bestowed by the members of the SAG-AFTRA Honors & Tributes Committee, and it's an accolade that is especially meaningful to her.

"This comes from my acting family," she told SAG-AFTRA, "so I am deeply honored and flattered. I mean, these are my comrades, the ones who really know what it takes. I'm very happy."

Sally Field Stands Tall


SALLY FIELD, IN A NOW-ICONIC pose from her Oscar-winning performance as a textile mill worker in the 1979 feature film *Norma Rae*, is front-and-center in SAG-AFTRA's collage oil painting by the late Arsen Roje (1937–2007). In 1990, the *Los Angeles Times* praised Roje's art of classic films: "Cinema buffs will love the paintings of Arsen Roje ...

Roje paints large works that duplicate classic film stills. We see a youthful Kirk Douglas as the arch private investigator interrogating the blonde in distress. Then there's the 20-year-old Robert Mitchum entering a Casablanca boudoir to find Rosalind Russell preening at her vanity table."

Titled *Union*, Roje's painting was one of several dozen artworks commissioned by Screen Actors Guild in 1993, in anticipation of

> its move into 5757 Wilshire Blvd., where SAG-AFTRA's national headquarters are still today. As part of SAG's

art program, overseen by SAG Board member and Building Committee Chair Christina Belford, the committee worked with Art Advisor Michelle Isenberg and photo historian Marc Wanamaker, who provided the source photographs.

With *Union*, the primary goal was to represent the strength of unity and the diversity of the Screen Actors Guild's membership in film and television, both past and present. The committee whittled down the photos to a group of about 30, from which they chose the final 19. All but five of the members depicted were still living at the time Roje painted it: Lucille Ball, Henry Fonda, Jackie Gleason, Will Sampson and Barbara Stanwyck. Four former members of the National Board, Fonda, Mako, Carroll O'Connor and Sampson appear, as well as SAG Life Achievement recipients Burt Lancaster (1991), Rita Moreno (2013), Sidney Poitier (1999), Barbara Stanwyck (1966) and, now, Sally Field.
